1.0 INTRODUCTION

The 2021 Annual Action Plan of the Sefwi Wiawso Municipal Assembly outlines the programmes and projects which the Municipal Assembly has planned to implement in 2021 with the collaboration and support of the Central Government, Donors, NGOs, CSOs, communities, etc. etc. They are programmes and projects earmarked in the 2018-2021 DMTDP that are in line the Medium-Term National Development Policy Framework (MTNDPF 2018-2021) christened "An Agenda for Jobs: Creating Prosperity and Equal Opportunity for All" and also enshrined with the Long Term National Development Policy Framework "a just, free, and prosperous nation with high levels of national income and broad-based social development" and the Medium-Term National Development Policy Framework, 2018-2021, with five main goals: build a prosperous society; create opportunities for all; safeguard the natural environment and ensure a resilient built environment; maintain a stable, united and safe society; and strengthening Ghana's role in international affairs.

1.1 DATE OF ESTABLISHMENT

The Legislative Instrument (L.I) 1386 establishing the Sefwi Wiawso District was enacted on 23rd November, 1988 under PNDC Law 207 and replaced by Local Government Act 462, 1993. It was elevated to a Municipal status in March, 2012 under Legislative Instrument, (L.I) 2015

1.2 VISION

To achieve total socio-economic growth and rural development through harnessing human and material resources and full participation of the citizenry in decision making and implementation processes manifest in the quality of life of the people.

1.3 MISSION STATEMENT

The Sefwi Wiawso Municipal Assembly exists as the highest political, administrative and planning authority to improve upon the quality of life of the people in the municipality by harnessing and utilizing all resources for sustainable development.

2.0 LOCATION/SIZE/POPULATION

This section gives a brief description of the location and demographic characteristics of the Municipality.

2.1 LOCATION AND BOUNDARIES

The Sefwi Wiawso Municipality is located in the Western North Region. The Municipality lies between latitudes 60N and 60 300 N and Longitudes 20 450' W and 20 150W. The Municipality is bounded by six (6) Districts and two regions. It is bounded to the west by Juabeso, Bodi and Sefwi Akontombra, to the east by Bibiani Anhwiaso Bekwai, to the south-east by Wassa Amenfi West and to the north by Asunafo South in the Ahafo region

2.2 SIZE

The municipality has a land area of 1,280 sq.km.

2.3 POPULATION

With factors affecting population changes held constant, the total population of the municipality for 2021 is projected to be 169,415 with female population constituting 49.9 % and males making up 50.1%. The population growth rate for the municipality is 1.8%.
